VLADIMIR ISSAEV BALLET MASTER, CHOREOGRAPHER AND ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Vladimir Issaev was born in Russia in 1954. His career started at the age of 11 at the Choreographic School of Voronezh. After working as a ballet dancer at the Opera House of Ufa and at the Opera House of Odessa, he received his masters degree from the "Gitis State Institute

of Arts in Moscow" as Ballet Master and Master Choreographer with the highest honors in 1986. He held the position of Academic and Artistic Director at the "Choreographic School of Frounze", in the former Soviet Union.

In 1987, he worked as Ballet Master and Regiseur for Ballet Metropolitano de Caracas and a vear later for Ballet Nacional de Caracas, directed by Vicente Nebrada, where he worked for more than ten years, teaching and coaching the principal dancers of the Company for their soloist classical roles. During his extensive career as a Choreographer and Ballet Master, Issaev has had the opportunity to work with many prestigious dancers and directors such as Papa Beriozoff for Don Quixote, having Julio Bocca and Eleonora Cassano as soloists; Alla Sizova, Alla Osipenko, Tatiana Terekhova and Irina Kolpakova. He has also been invited as a quest Ballet Master by several companies such as Le Jeune Ballet de France, Ballet Nacional de España. Les Ballet Jazz de Montreal. Orlando Ballet among others. Until August of 2002 he held the position of Ballet Master at the Miami City Ballet School. As a Choreographer, he has staged several ballets in Russia, the Puerto Rico, Peru, Japan and Venezuela. Mr. Issaev was the recipient of the "New Choreographer Award" for his piece "El Encuentro" at the Dance Under the Stars Choreography Competition in Palm Desert, California. In June of 2005 Ballet Concierto de Puerto Rico presented the premiere of Issaev's work "Doctor Ouch!", a ballet in two acts based on the story of Korney Chukovskiy with great success restaging it in 2007. In 2004. Vladimir Issaev staged "Shostakovich Suites" for the Voronezh Choreographic School in Russia. An invitation from Prima Ballerina Altanay Assylmuratova, director of the Vaganova - Kirov School of Ballet in Saint Petersburg followed to stage a Ballet for the graduating students joining the Mariinsky (Kirov) Ballet Company. This choreography premiered in March of 2006 at the Mariinsky Theater in Saint Petersburg, Russia. Due to its success this choreographic work was presented again in June of 2006. Vladimir Issaev belongs to the Artistic Advisory Council for the Classical Dance Alliance. He is recipient of the Honorable Merit Diploma from the Terpsihora Foundation for the Advancement of the Arts of Dance of Saint Petersburg, Russia, in recognition for his outstanding performance enhancing the art of classical ballet on the Vaganova Style in the United States. He has also been awarded with the National Foundation for the Advancement in the Arts award as the most influential Ballet teacher.

Mr. Issaev was also awarded in 2009 as Best Arts Educator of the State of Florida by the Florida Alliance for Arts Education. He has been Artistic Director of the International Ballet Competition in Caracas, Venezuela; Artistic Director of the Russian Ballet of South Africa and International Ballet Competition in Lima, Peru. In January of 2011 his ballet Stone Flower was premiered in Nagoya, Japan with tremendous success and the greatest reviews. In 2013, two new ballets were premiered in Japan during the Aichi Triennial Festival and resented by the Michiko Matsumoto Ballet: Polovetsian Dances and the premiere of Firebird. Mr. Issaev has been invited to present his dancers and choreographies in Poland, Germany, Peru, Indonesia and most recently he had the honor to teach Master Classes at the Beijing Ballet Academy and has been named Artistic Director of the Asia Ballet Academy in Malaysia.

Maestro Vladimir Issaev has been recently awarded "A Life for Dance" at the International Ballet Festival of Miami for his long lifetime achievements in Ballet. He received a recent Proclamation from Mayor Daniella Levin Cava declaring June 11, Vladimir Issaev's Day and he received a recognition from the Department of Cultural Affairs from the Peruvian government in Lima for his contribution to the ballet in Peru.

Mr. Issaev is considered one of the top ballet masters and choreographers world wide.



MARY CARMEN CATOYA PRIMA BALLERINA AND BALLET MISTRESS

Prima ballerina of Miami was born in Venezuela. She began her training at the age of six in Caracas and began her professional career at the age of 13. She danced with the

Youth Ballet of Venezuela, the Contemporary Ballet of Caracas, Cleveland Ballet and as a principal with the National Ballet of Caracas, where she was coached and trained by Ballet Master Vladimir Issaev. She danced as a principal at the Miami City Ballet from 1999 to 2015. Her repertoire includes works of George Balanchine, Vicente Nebrada, Dennis Nahat, Alberto Mendez and Vladimir Issaev. Ms. Catoya has danced extensively abroad at many festivals and galas, including an international gala before the King and Queen of Spain, the inauguration of the Theater Simon Bolivar in Brazil, Dance Aspen, and the Gala of Stars at the Festival International de Santander and was the prima ballerina responsible to open the Arsht Center in Miami with her interpretation of Don Quixote. She has also dancer at the Gala Night at the Mikhailovsky Theater in Saint Petersburg, Russia and at the Orlando Competition Gala of the Stars. She has danced with both Taras Domitro and Daniel Sarabia in Queretaro, Mexico and with Rolando Sarabia at the Fire Island Festival in New York City.

In July 2011 she was the prima ballerina for Les etes de la Danse at the theatre du Chatelet in Paris with Miami City Ballet.

She received the award "Premio Casa del Artista" as Best Classical Dancer of the Year in 1999 and Premio Municipal de Danza 2002 as best dancer.

Mary Carmen have been coached and trained by remarkable artists such as Jose Pares, Vicente Nebrada, Vladimir Issaev, Rafael Portillo, Zane Wilson Karelia Moreno, Elena Madan Vera at the Ballet Nacional de Caracas, Dennis Nahat at Cleveland Ballet, Ileana Lopez, Violette Verdy, Jean Pierre Frohlich, Maria Cagliari, Mary Ashley and Edward Villella at Miami City Ballet. Most recently she performed in Poland, Mexico, Peru and Indonesia next to her ballet master Vladimir Issaev.

Ms. Catoya is principal dancer and also the Ballet Mistress of Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida since 2015.



LUSIAN HERNANDEZ BALLET MISTRESS / CHOREOGRAPHER

Born in Barquisimeto, Venezuela where she started her ballet training at the Fundacion Escuela de Ballet Clasico del Edo. Lara. She has participated in international dance festivals including the Festival Danza Joven in Colombia and attended the Metropolitan Ballet Theatre in Minneapolis. She

was awarded Bronze Medal at the International Ballet Competition in Caracas, Venezuela. After attending the Summer Intensive Program of Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida in 2011, she was invited to join the company. Since then, she has performed the repertoire of the company including Yanis Pikieris' Danzon, and Issaev's The Nutcracker, Chipollino, Suite of Waltzes, Dr. Ouch!, Shostakovich Suites, Vicente Nebrada's Pentimento, Alberto Mendez's Tarde en La Siesta, A Celebration to Klimt, Coppelia, Paquita, and Glinka Suite Fantastique among others.

Ms. Hernandez is happy to continue as a ballet Mistress of Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida for the current season.



GISELLE DEYA VISCB SCHOOL DIRECTOR

Born in Havana, Cuba, Ms. Giselle embarked on her ballet journey at the age of 9 at the Alejo Carpentier Ballet School, later graduating with honors from the National Ballet School of Cuba. Mentored by renowned instructors such as Fernando Alonso, Ramona de Saa, and Loipa Araujo, she joined the

National Ballet of Cuba in 1998, showcasing her talents in classical roles. Earning honors in 2006 from the Higher Institute of Art of Cuba, Ms. Giselle's expertise extends to teaching, where she became a faculty member at the National Ballet School of Cuba. Her teaching repertoire includes ballet and pointe techniques, variations, pas de deux, character dance, ballroom dance, and repertoire. She played a crucial role in launching Guidance Vocational Workshops, contributing as a Professor of Methodology. Ms. Giselle has shared her knowledge globally, coaching students for international competitions and working as a repertoire teacher in Cuba and Mexico. She became Ballet Mistress at The Ballet Art School in Belize and, from 2010 to 2016, led the Bhakti Victor Ullate School in Spain, serving as Head of Studies and personal assistant to Master Ullate, while also being Ballet Mistress for the Victor Ullate Ballet Company, Her career includes staging numerous classical productions like Graduation Ball, Giselle, Coppelia, Don Quixote, Swan Lake, and Sleeping Beauty. In 2016, Ms. Giselle assumed the role of Ballet Mistress and Director at the Vladimir Issaev School of Classical Ballet, bringing her wealth of experience and artistry to shape the next generation of dancers.

SYNOPSIS Act 1

The evil old fairy Hamza has the Emir's daughter Farfalla captive who now serves as her maid. Looking in the mirror Hamza wishes only to become young and pretty again, but to do this she must be kissed by a young prince. Farfalla's lover, gardener Patimate, would do anything to liberate her, but he only makes Hamza furious.

Resting from a hunt Prince Djalma and his entourage enter. Djalma requests something to drink. The prince dances a mazurka with the maid and thanks her with a medallion. Hamza flies into a rage, lures the maid into a cage and using her magic stick, a beautiful butterfly emerges: Le Papillon.

After the Prince and his entourage have left Hamza's castle they reach a forest clearing, where shortly the butterflies fly in. The Prince captures Farfalla and demands Hamza to turn the butterfly into a girl so he can marry her, but Hamza immobilizes Djalma instead. The Prince's entourage take the Prince, Farfalla, Hamza and Patimate to the palace.

INTERMISSION



Everyone arrives to the palace of the Emir Ismaël. Djalma's tutor Mohammed, asks Hamza to undo the spell to the prince. Mohamed and his friend they dance a beautiful Pas de Deux. Arabian princesses accompany Prince Djalma. It emerges that Farfalla is in fact the Emir's daughter. The prince tries to embrace Farfalla, however Hamza, lurking nearby throws herself between them and obtains the kiss meant for Farfalla.

The spell works for Hamza and she is turned into a beautiful young girl. Prince Djalma is confused. He courts the rejuvenated fairy, and finally marries her and to his disgrace, Hamza becomes ugly and old again. Farfalla escapes from the palace and Patimate goes after her.

Hamza comes to the garden to look for her magic stick with a torch. The Butterfly is attracted by the glow of the torch, but in touching the lamp she burns her wings and the charm fades in the arms of Patimate.

Hamza brings Djalma to her castle, and butterflies say farewell to Farfalla.

The story takes place at a Russian fair in 1830. Gypsies and dancing girls entertain the crowd. Drums announce the appearance of the Old Charlatan, who charms the captivated audience introducing the puppet figures of Petrouchka, the Ballerina and the Moor. The Old Charlatan casts a magic spell with his flute. The puppets come to life, leap from their little stage, and perform a vigorous dance among the astounded carnival-goers.

The second scene, after the performance, is set in Petrouchka's room. Petrouchka leads a sad "life" behind the show curtains. Although Petrouchka is a puppet, he feels human emotions. He is in love with the beautiful Ballerina. The Ballerina enters the room. Petrouchka tries to profess his love, but the Ballerina rejects his pathetic advances hurting Petrouchka's feelings.

In the third scene, the Moor, who leads a much more comfortable "life" than Petrouchka, plays with a coconut. The Charlatan places the Ballerina in the Moor's room. The Ballerina is attracted to the Moor's handsome appearance. She plays a saucy tune and begins to dance with the Moor. Petrouchka breaks free from his cell. Petrouchka attacks the Moor, but soon realizes he is too small and weak. The Moor defeats Petrouchka. Petrouchka runs for his life, with the Moor chasing him, and escapes from the room.

In the fourth scene, during the carnival, a series of characters dance with joy. Gypsies bring a dancing bear, followed in turn by the crowd. As the amusement reaches its peak, noise is heard from the puppet-theater. The Ballerina suddenly runs across the scene, followed by Petrouchka and the Moor in hot pursuit. The crowd is horrified when the Moor catches up with Petrouchka and strikes him. The Charlatan seeks to restore calm by picking up shaking the dummy, to remind everyone that Petrouchka is but a puppet. As night falls and the crowd disperses as it begins to snow. Petrouchka's ghost appears on the roof of the little theater. The Charlatan

regrets giving the puppets human emotions causing one to destroy the other and sadly returns to his puppet theatre.

She began her training at Vladimir Issaev School of Classical ballet at a very young age. She performed in many of the company's productions such as The Nutcracker, Coppelia, Suite of Waltzes, among other classical and neoclassical pieces. She participated in various renowned dance festivals in Germany, Poland, and Peru. Since her promotion to corps of ballet in 2022 she has performed ballets from Vicente Nebrada Pentimento and Double Clef, as well as Lusian Hernandez' Corpus, and Arapo.



MOEGI MATSUZAWA

Moegi Matsuzawa, was born in Yokohama, Japan and received her early training at Abiatt Ballet Studio in her native country. She continued her training at Pacific Northwest Ballet School. She later received a scholarship and joined The Rock School for Dance Education. Ms. Matsuzawa also attended Summer Intensive Programs at Pacific Northwest Ballet School, School of American Ballet and Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida. She performed "Coppélia" at the Public Juridical Foundation Japan Ballet Association and Bruce Wells' "Beauty and the Beast" at Pacific Northwest Ballet School.



ATARU MATSUYA

Mr. Matsuya was born in Japan. He began his early training at the Lucia Ballet School. He later was accepted at the Pôle National Supérieur de Danse Rosella Hightower in Mougins, Cannes – France where he graduated. Mr. Matsuya received Bronze Medals at the Hatsukaichi International Ballet Competition and the Youth America Grand Prix – Japan. He was also awarded a Silver Medal at the Kobe All Japan Dance Competition and performed at the MIBC Open de Medellin as a quest dancer.



KANON MURAKAMI

Graduated from Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre School, Ms. Murakami attended her formative artistic years at the Ariake New City School of Ballet in Tokyo in her native Japan. She participated in the Machida Ballet Competition, awarded with a First Prize and a Special Jury Prize. She just came back from performing at the Gala of the Miami International Ballet Competition, Open de Medellin as a quest dancer.



SAAYA OKADA

From Japan. She trained and performed with Reiko Matsuoka Ballet Company. An international award winner Ms. Okada also trained at Ayano Tsuchiya's Ballet Studio and danced with Ballet Theatre United Kingdom. She had the opportunity to dance with Orlando Ballet Company in Cinderella and The Nutcracker. Ms Okada has performed soloist roles with Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida since joining in 2021. Among them: Viva Espana, The Nutcracker, Arapo, Tarde en La Siesta, Suite of Waltzes. Most recently she has received the Ewa Glowaska Award at the MIBC 2023.



JOSÉ LUIS PECHENÉ

He comes from Philadelphia Ballet II. Mr. Pechené began his formal training at INCOLBALLET in Cali – Colombia where he graduated and later at Danso and Fort Lauderdale Youth Ballet where he received complementary training. He received a full scholarship to attend the Summer Intensive Program at The Rock School for Dance Education in Philadelphia. Mr. Pechené was awarded 1st Place in the Universal Ballet Competition Regionals in Fort Lauderdale and 1st Place in the Youth American Grand Prix Semi Finals in Boston, both in the Senior Male Division Classical.



LOUISE RIGBY




